The *International Network for Health Workforce Education* (INHWE) and the *Academy of Medical Educators* (AoME) are delighted to announce the details of our combined International Congress of Health Workforce Education and Research and AoME Annual Academic Meeting – *Learning Together for Clinical Excellence*. This 3-day Conference will take place in Cardiff, Wales from Tuesday 27 to Thursday 29 June 2023.

The call for abstracts is now open. **INHWE** would like to invite potential participants to submit abstracts on the overall conference theme of Interprofessional Education or any topic related to our many INHWE Working Group themes. We will also accept abstracts submitted for topics that should be taught in an interprofessional way, such as communication and leadership. If you have any doubt about your abstract's relevance, please contact INHWE Director, David Smith, or the relevant Working Group lead.

AoME also welcomes abstracts on the overall conference theme and is particularly interested in abstracts around activity where there has been an interprofessional learning approach with demonstrated improvement in healthcare, but we will also consider submissions of all interests for posters, short presentations and workshops.

Conference Theme: *Learning Together for Clinical Excellence*

Today, patients are rarely looked after by just one health professional, and in the context of a complex healthcare system, effective teamworking and interprofessional learning is essential for the delivery of effective and patient-centred care. We are delighted to be working in partnership to bring you this joint three-day conference providing an excellent opportunity for us and our delegates to strengthen links and learn from diverse healthcare professions to establish new ways of working together.

This conference is one of the best opportunities for educators across the health professions to come together to share good practice, the latest innovations in healthcare education, as well as for networking, academic collaboration, and professional development.

Practical Information

Guidelines for Abstract Submission

- Submit your abstract online via the [dedicated portal](#). Abstracts sent via email will not be considered
- Submissions and presentations must be in English
- Abstracts should be no more than 250 words in length (excluding the title, authors and up to 3 references)
- During the submission process there is an option to select which organisation you would prefer to consider your submission, either INHWE or AoME. Whilst we endeavour to meet your preference, we cannot guarantee which day of the conference your abstract will be selected for
- You may submit more than one abstract, providing all work is distinct from each other
- The deadline for abstract submission is 23:59 on 6 February 2023.

Abstract Submission Terms & Conditions

- All correspondence relating to the abstract will be sent to the corresponding author only. It is their responsibility to pass on information to co-authors
- You must confirm that you have permission from all authors to submit your abstract
- In submitting an abstract you confirm that you, or the presenting author, will register and pay to attend the conference. There are options to attend only on the day you are presenting, although we would strongly encourage you to attend either the full conference, or the days specific to your chosen organisation
- You will be able to select the type of presentation you prefer, however we cannot guarantee this, and your abstract will be considered for all formats should the reviewers deem appropriate
- Any changes to the presenter(s) or any other contact details must be communicated directly to AoME (info@medicaleducators.org)
- Authors can edit their abstract until **23 April 2023**. No further changes will be accepted after this date.

Registration for the Conference

- When submissions are accepted, all participants must confirm their involvement by registering and paying the conference fee by **Friday 14th April 2023**. We cannot guarantee that presenters who miss this deadline will be included in official conference publications, including the programme and abstract book
- All presenters who attend the conference are expected to register and pay all registration, travel and accommodation costs.

Submission Categories

Abstract submission is now open. There is a joint submission site for INHWE and AoME, please select the organisation and theme most relevant to your submission.

INHWE invites authors to submit abstracts on any topic related to healthcare education and training. You can submit a "classic" academic abstract (including introduction, methods, discussion and conclusion) or short paper on the submission system.

AoME is particularly interested in abstracts around activity where there has been an interprofessional learning approach with demonstrated improvement in healthcare, but welcomes submissions of all interests for posters, short presentations and workshops.

Themes include:

- Learning from success, established IPE
- Leadership
- Communication
- Non-clinical medical educators
- Healthcare Improvement
- Application of reflective practise
- Person-centredness approach / involving patients in multi-professional learning
- Developing your healthcare educators
- Other/Miscellaneous – other interesting projects which fit within INHWE and/or AoME remit (free text for authors to provide theme)

Submissions will be reviewed by the organisation selected in the submission process.

- INHWE submissions will be reviewed by INHWE Director, **Mr. David Smith**, along with colleagues from the host organisations, and members of the INHWE Advisory Board
- AoME submissions will be reviewed by the Education Committee Chair **Dr Claire Stocker** and colleagues from this committee and AoME Council. Reviewers will judge the abstracts on the following criteria:
 - o Originality
 - o Academic Rigour
 - o Relevance to Conference Theme
 - o Reflects core values of medical educators
 - o Abstracts submitted with Student/FY1/FY2 authors will receive an additional factor score.
